Music
Camp
At U of A

High school musicians throughout Alaska will soon tune their instruments and clear their voices for participation in the University of Alaska's fifth annual Summer Music Camp, to be held on campus July 1-26.

THE FOUR-WEEK camp, part of the university's summer sessions program, mixes intensive music instruction with recreation. A popular highlight of the camp is production of a Broadway musical.

Music instruction is in band, orchestra, ensembles, chorus and opera. Private lessons will be given in both instruments and voice.

The camp is open to all students in grades 8-12, including those who graduated from high school this spring and who will be entering eighth grade this fall.

PROF. CHARLES W. Davis, head of UA's Music Department, will direct the camp. He is a teacher of voice and director of the Choir of the North and University Chorus.

Other faculty members include Duane J. Mikow, Frank Pinkerton and Jean-Paul Billaud.

Mikow is UA's director of bands and orchestra. He has traveled in Alaska extensively as a judge and instructor in many high school music events.

PINKERTON has been coordinator of elementary string music for Anchorage schools, conductor of the Anchorage Symphony and Youth Orchestra and has served on the faculty of the Anchorage Community College.

Billaud is an internationally-noted concert pianist and teacher of piano at UA. He has presented concert programs throughout Alaska and performed as guest soloist with the Anchorage Symphony.

Tuition fee for the camp is \$50. Supervised dormitory accommodations for the musicians are available at the university for \$78.25 for the four weeks. Meals will be served at the University Commons.
