## GUEST ARTIST

Paul Sharpe maintains an active career in variety of roles as a soloist, chamber and orchestral double bassist. Over the past year he has performed in recital at Brazil's Sixth International Double Bass Encounter in Pirenopolis, Brazil; appeared as guest artist with the Fairbanks Summer Arts Festival (Alaska); performed Paul Ramsier's *Divertimento Concertante for Solo Double Bass and Orchestra* with the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra; and premiered Stuart Hinds' *Concertino for Double Bass and Orchestra* with the Dallas Chamber Orchestra. In March, he performed Schubert's "Trout" Quintet with John Nakamatsu, Paul Coletti, Nathaniel Rosen, and Paul Rosenthal as part of Dallas' Chamber Music International concert series.

He has received fellowships to the Tanglewood Music Center, Aspen Music Festival, and the Pacific Music Festival (Sapporo, Japan) and has been a guest artist at the Pine Mountain Music Festival (Michigan), the Anchorage Festival of Music, the Festival of Two Worlds (Spoleto, Italy), and 20<sup>th</sup> Century Unlimited (Santa Fe, NM). He has been a prizewinner at several solo competitions, including the International Society of Bassists Solo Competition in 1997, and winner of the Aspen Music Festival's Double Bass Concerto Competition in 1996. As a teacher of double bass he has held faculty positions at the University of North Texas and Augustana College (Rock Island, IL).

Currently, he is Artist Performer/Teacher of Double Bass at Texas Tech University and is principal bass of the Lubbock Symphony Orchestra. He also performs regularly with the San Antonio Symphony and the Fort Worth Symphony Orchestra. Over the past two years he has been a regular reviewer of new music and recordings for the English publication, *Double Bassist* magazine.

Mr. Sharpe grew up in Anchorage, Alaska, where he studied double bass with Miriam Delap. As a high school student he played in the Anchorage Youth Symphony, Anchorage Symphony Orchestra, and the Anchorage Civic Opera Orchestra. After graduation from high school, he attended and attained his Bachelor of Music degree from Northwestern University where he studied with Jeff Bradetich (now at the University of North Texas). He earned his master's degree from the University of Iowa, studying with Diana Gannett (now at the University of Michigan). Despite the fact that his career has taken him all over the United States and the world, he makes every effort to visit Alaska as frequently as possible – a place he still considers home.

## HISTORY - ANCHORAGE YOUTH SYMPHONY

In the early 1960's many individuals recognized the need for an orchestra for the youth of Anchorage. Forerunners of what became known as the Anchorage Youth Symphony were organized and conducted by such prominent local musicians and educators as Kurt Pasch, Jeanne (Ray) Bruhn, Charles Gorsuch and Marlow Thomas. Young musicians of that period were trained in the Anchorage schools and gave many concerts throughout the city.

In 1965 the Anchorage School District hired Frank Pinkerton as its director of music. In that position he formally organized the Anchorage Youth Symphony. As its music director, Mr. Pinkerton oversaw the expansion of opportunities to perform throughout the state, and the youth symphony's reputation grew steadily. The Elementary Honor Orchestra and Band and the Junior High Honor Orchestra were added to the district's program. The elementary and junior high orchestras and bands are still funded by the Anchorage School District, whereas the Anchorage Youth Symphony is now an independent, non profit organization. Mr. Pinkerton retired in 1978.

Dewey Ehling replaced Frank Pinkerton as music director of both the Anchorage School District and the youth symphony. For the next eight years until his retirement in 1986, he expanded the touring schedule, traveling and performing in Canada, Great Britain, Australia and New Zealand. Domestically, the orchestra performed in Washington state, California and Washington D.C.

In 1986 and 1987 Linn Weeda led the orchestra. Weeda was a graduate of the Youth Symphony in its early years. Under his leadership the orchestra toured and performed in New York City at Lincoln Center.

In 1988 John Duff of Fairbanks led the orchestra. During his tenure the orchestra toured Scotland. In 1991 Russell Guyver, a professor of music at University of Alaska Anchorage, succeeded Duff. Guyver instituted a series of retreats, to encourage the social interaction of members, as well as concerts in the Matanuska-Susitna Valley.

Linn Weeda was again engaged as the music director in 1992, and continues in that position. In recent years the orchestra's program has expanded to include coaching by local professional musicians, many of whom were in the youth symphony as young players. Other activities under Weeda have included an annual recording project, a chamber music series, an alumni association, and scholarships.

Members of the orchestra are chosen each year during auditions in the spring, and are drawn from every public and private school in the area as well as from the Matanuska-Susitna valley. In previous years, students flew in from Kodiak and Kenai to rehearse and perform with the youth symphony.

The symphony is sponsored by the Anchorage Youth Symphony Association and governed by the Anchorage Youth Symphony Board of Directors.

Without great music, education is not complete. Music education has long been an educational priority of the Anchorage School District with classes in orchestra, band and chorus offered at the elementary, junior and senior high levels. The youth symphony encourages and supports the music program within the schools in the belief that great music played well instills in young people discipline and the joy of great musical ideas.

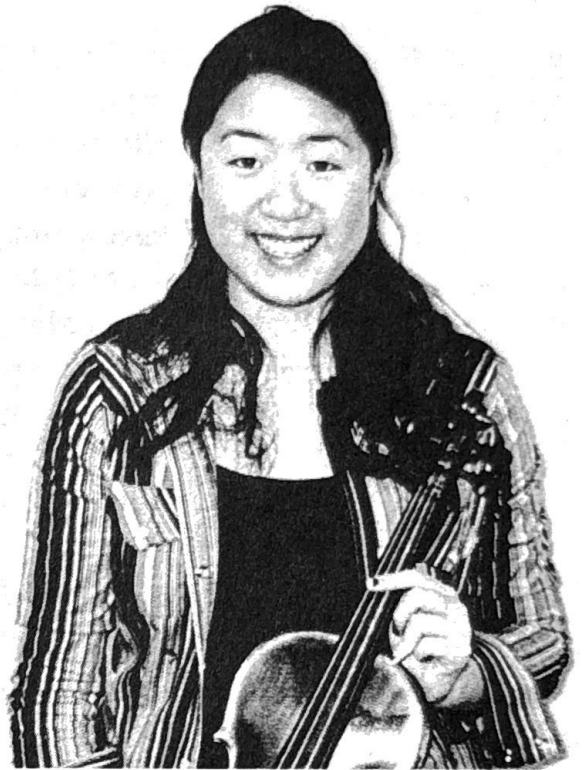

## SENIOR SPOTLIGHT



David Martinson

**David Martinson** is a senior at Chugiak High School and a two year member of Anchorage Youth Symphony where he has been principal trombone for both years playing both tenor and alto trombones. He has earned a band letter every year in high school and has been vice president of the band council at Chugiak for two years. He has been a member of the Chugiak Symphonic and Jazz Band for two years. He has also earned superior ratings at Solo and Ensemble Festival for four years as well as playing in All State Band for two years and All State Orchestra for one year. He was lead trombone in the Sixth Grade Honor Band. He has played with the Anchorage Symphony Orchestra, the Anchorage Festival of Music in 2002, and the UAF Jazz Festival Honor Band. He is also a singer having sung nine years in the Alaska Children's Choir, two years in the Chugiak Swing Choir, and as a member of the

Anchorage Opera Chorus in *The Barber of Seville*. He has performed at Carnegie Hall, Sydney Opera House and St. Peter's Basilica in Rome. In addition to tenor and alto trombones, he plays bass trombone, euphonium, violin, bass, piano, percussion, didgeridoo, tuba, kazoo, bass trumpet, recorder, ocarina, slide whistle, spoons, washboard, musical saw, saxophone, and harmonica. He has received occasional Honor Roll awards, an Advanced Placement Scholar award, is a recognized math guru among his peers, a member of the Chugiak High School football team, constantly in honors and advanced placement classes, and has realized his childhood dream of being six feet tall. He built the largest trebuchet (like a catapult) west of the Mississippi River. He is faster than a speeding bullet, can leap over tall buildings in a single bound and is strong like a bull.

He obviously has musical interests, and in addition, he carries a rubber duckie at all times, likes dressing up like large blue furry monsters, spraying comrades with trombone water, chasing geese, mocking oboes and making voices, juggling and mountain unicycling, talking during youth symphony, skiing, scaring small children, and ditch diving.

He also won superior ratings in oboe in the Region IV & Alaska Solo and Ensemble Festival for three years. He was the woodwind competition winner in the high school division of the Alaska Music Teachers Association in November of '02. He has played in the fall productions of Anchorage Opera orchestra and the Anchorage Concert Chorus orchestra for two years and has performed in the Hidden Valley Oboe Master Class with John Mack for two summers. He has been a member of the

He is a University of Alaska Scholar (awarded to the top 10% of graduating seniors). He lettered for four years as a member of the East High School varsity swim team. He was 4<sup>th</sup> in backstroke in Region IV for two years and qualified for state championship in backstroke two years, and on the 200 and 400 meter relay teams one year. He has volunteered to play oboe from time to time at church, has volunteered in literacy activities with Volunteers of America and at Loussac Library, and helped build sets for the Anchorage Opera production *Semele*. He plans to attend college majoring in psychology with a pre-medicine emphasis and a minor in oboe music performance and after that to enter medical school and train as a psychiatrist, perhaps including music therapy in his practice. He plans to continue with music as a lifetime avocation.
