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Karl Haas

Karl Haas, recipient of eight honorary doctorates in music, fine arts and humanities, is author and host of ADVENTURES IN GOOD MUSIC. The daily hour-long broadcasts are acclaimed both in North America and around the world. He was awarded the coveted George Foster Peabody Award, the "Emmy" Award of Broadcasting, a rare national professional honor.

A resident of New York City, Mr. Haas appears regularly as a recitalist and conductor. He has conducted a series of live ADVENTURES IN GOOD MUSIC in New York's Carnegie Hall and is currently engaged in a much acclaimed annual spring and fall series at New York's Metropolitan Museum of Art.

His book, INSIDE MUSIC, is an elaborate reference work dealing with all phases of music, including a chapter on the interrelationship of music, the arts and current events. Published in 1984 by Doubleday, it is now in its second printing.

Mr. Haas was born in Germany, and studied at the Conservatory of Mannheim and the University of Heidelberg. He has served as the United States delegate to congresses of the International Music Council of UNESCO.

Eugene Rousseau

One of the great saxophonists of the world, Eugene Rousseau has had an extensive background in many types and styles of music. A native of the Chicago area, he presented a highly successful debut in New York's Carnegie Hall in 1965. He has had engagements in Canada, Great Britain, France, Germany, Holland, Sweden, Norway, Denmark, Finland, Austria, Czechoslovakia, New Zealand, Australia, Africa, South America, and Japan, in addition to all quarters of the United States.

He has recorded numerous solo and chamber works for the saxophone. His published works include numerous solos and arrangements, a two-volume METHOD FOR SAXOPHONE (Kjos), and SAXOPHONE HIGH TONES (Etoile) also available in French and German.
