## SENIOR PROFILES

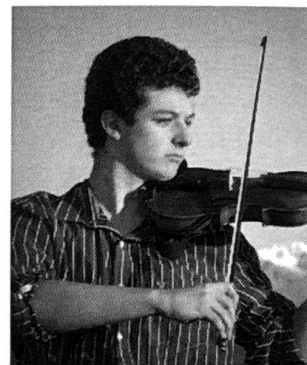


### BRETT LINDSAY

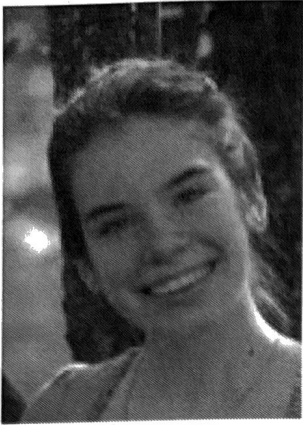
### KATIE BALCAO

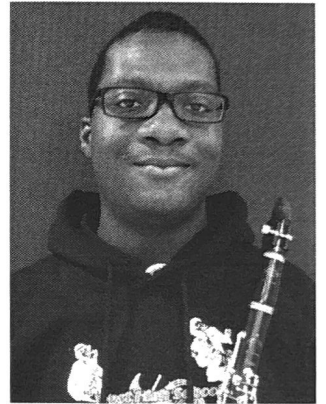
### EVDOKIYA HAIL
